can help us make decisions on how to allocate limited resources by examining the predicted tradeoffs between effectiveness, fairness, and disparity reduction across racial/ethnic groups



### **Equal Allocation**


Equal quantity of PrEP for each race/ethnicity



Equal number of infections averted across MSM of all racial/ethnic groups

#### **Count Allocation**


Proportional by race/ethnicity based on number of PLWH in each race/ethnicty



**Greater impact in averting infections among Hispanics** 

#### **Rate Allocation**

Proportional by race/ethnicity based on new diagnosis rate relative to race/ethnicity



Greater impact in averting infections among African Americans

Equity demands that modeling studies explicitly consider the needs of key populations who remain at greater risk for poor HIV-related outcomes due to a range of social, economic, and demographic factors. These data can be useful in decision-making that centers impact and fairness in the process of expanding PrEP.
