HEALTH CARE DESERTS

ON JANUARY 1ST, 2022 CALIFORNIA BECAME THE FIRST STATE TO REQUIRE HEALTHCARE PLANS AND INSURERS COVER THE COSTS OF HIV/STI HOME TEST KITS. SENATE BILL 306 AIMS TO REDUCE BARRIERS TO HIV AND STI TESTING. HOWEVER, SB 306 REQUIRES A CLINICIAN'S PRESCRIPTION OR STANDING ORDER FOR HOME TEST KITS TO BE COVERED BY A HEALTHCARE PLAN.

SB 306: STD COVERAGE AND CARE ACT

One third of California counties have a low rate of healthcare providers who can prescribe home test kits for HIV/STI.

Many of the counties in Central and Southern CA have a positive association between HIV/STI and % uninsured. As proportion of uninsured residents increases, HIV/STI rates increase.

Central (farming counties) and Southern
California (Riverside and San Bernardino counties
which are EHE jurisdictions) have a high proportion
of African American/Blacks Latinos, and young
people. These populations are highly
vulnerable to HIV/STI and a high
proportion reside in counties with
a low number of healthcare
providers per 100,000
residents.
